Dear President,

I am writing to you with a deep commitment to the future of our profession. Nursing is at a crucial moment, facing unprecedented challenges, but also unique opportunities to consolidate its healthcare leadership at a global level. Nurses have demonstrated their essential role in health systems, but we still face challenges in representation, recognition and decision-making.

For this reason, I want to share with you my candidacy for the Presidency of ICN, a candidacy that is born from the conviction that, **if we strengthen our organization**, **we will strengthen the voice of all nurses and of every National Nursing Association** (NNAs).

I present this candidacy under the slogan:

"Empower nurses, lead the future"

This slogan reflects my vision for a **stronger**, **more inclusive and more influential ICN**. An ICN that not only represents nursing in the global arena, but also **actively supports each NNA** in its growth and positioning within its own country.

Three key axes to transform ICN and global nursing

My candidacy is based on **three fundamental pillars**, which define the future I want to build together with you:

ICN empowerment: a stronger organization with more global impact

ICN must be a powerful, influential and decisive voice in major international forums. Our organization has enormous potential to influence policy decisions that affect the profession and global health, but to do so, we need:

- Greater presence and leadership in international organizations such as the WHO, UN, ILO and other global decision-making bodies.
- To strengthen the financial sustainability of ICN, ensuring resources that allow the development of strategic programs without depending exclusively on the fees of NNAs.
- **To make ICN a more accessible and connected organization**, promoting more direct communication channels with NNAs so that they all feel truly represented.

• A strong ICN **is not just an administrative structure**; it is an organization that protects and empowers every nurse in the world.

Empowering National Nursing Associations (NNAs): more representation and voice in their countries

NNAs are the **core of ICN**, but many of them face difficulties in their own countries: **low membership**, **low visibility to their governments and lack of resources**.

To make NNAs more influential, I propose:

- Strategies to increase the affiliation of nurses to NNAs, providing them with effective tools to attract more members and strengthen their representativeness.
- **Support in dialogue with governments and ministries of health**, offering support and advice to improve the political influence of each NNA.
- To foster collaboration between NNAs, creating spaces for the exchange of experiences and successful strategies between countries with similar contexts.

• ICN must be **a real ally** of NNAs, **not only a reference body**, but a structure that actively works so that each national association **is strengthened and has more weight in its country**.

Empowering nurses: more leadership, more skills, more recognition

Nursing is constantly evolving, but there are still **barriers to its full professional development**. It is essential that nurses can take a more active role in decision-making, health management and the development of health policies.

For this reason, I want to promote:

- Access to advanced training and specialization, promoting international standards of nursing education.
- The recognition of nursing as a leading profession in health systems, promoting initiatives to improve working conditions, salaries and access to leadership positions.
- The integration of new competencies for nursing, such as nurse prescribing, public health leadership and applied research.

• An empowered nursing not only cares, but also leads the transformation of health systems.

Why do I think I'm the best candidate to lead this change?

My experience has allowed me to gain **an in-depth understanding of the challenges and opportunities** we face as a profession. Throughout my career, I have worked in the key areas for nursing development:

- **Member of the ICN Board of Directors,** which has given me a deep knowledge of the organization and its processes.
- Experience in international leadership, with participation, for example, in the European Federation of Nurses (EFN), the Pan American Federation of Nursing (FEPPEN) and in other international organizations and institutions.
- I work on nursing regulation and governance, promoting the standardization of nursing practice, the prescription and recognition of new competencies in direct dealings with the Spanish Ministry of Health.
- Solid experience in financial management and strategic planning, ensuring the economic viability of nursing organizations.

• Extensive experience in the teaching, research and care nursing fields, which has allowed me to have direct knowledge of the different realities in which we work as nurses.

• Not only do I have the necessary experience, but a clear vision of what we can achieve together.

Let's build the future together

I firmly believe in the power of collective work. The future of ICN is not built only from ICN Board of Directors, but from the active participation of each NNA and every nurse in the world.

I invite you to join this vision and work together to strengthen ICN, empower NNAs and make nursing an **unstoppable force in global health**.
